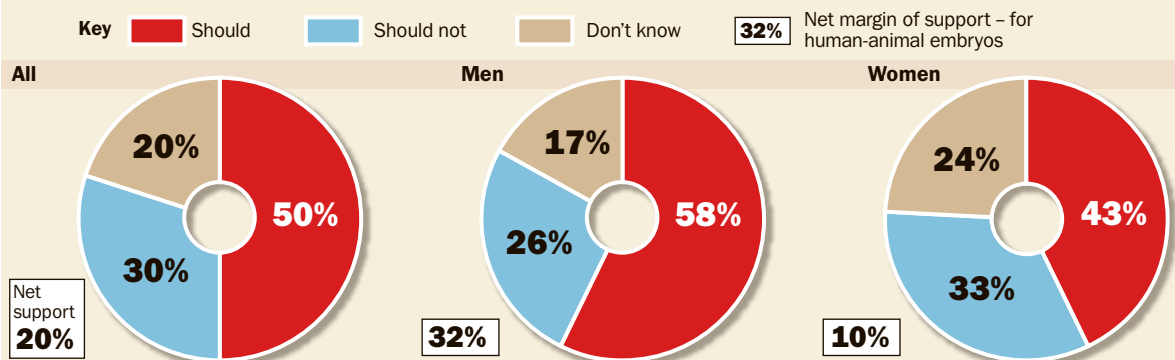


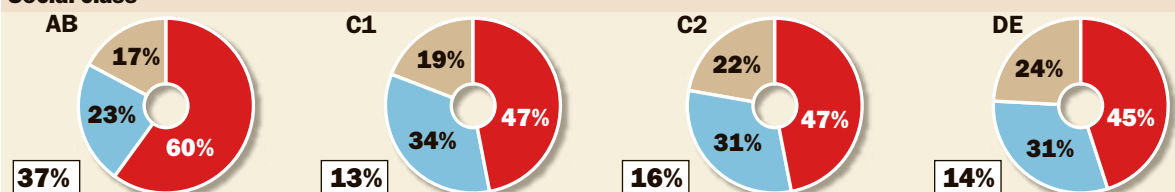
# Should human-animal embryos be allowed?

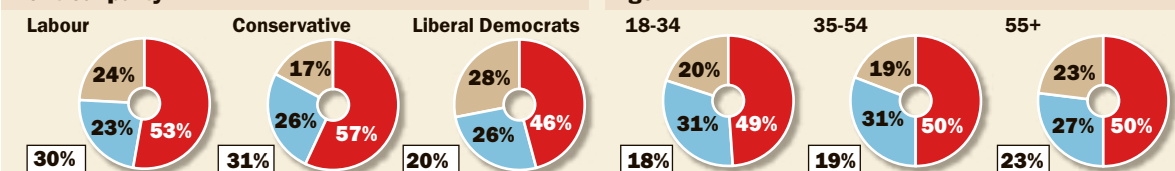
embryos in a womb, or to study them for more than 14 days. Do you think these experiments should or should not be permitted? If you don't have a clear view either way, please say so



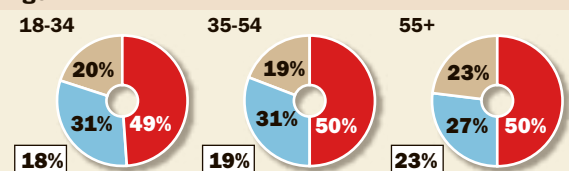

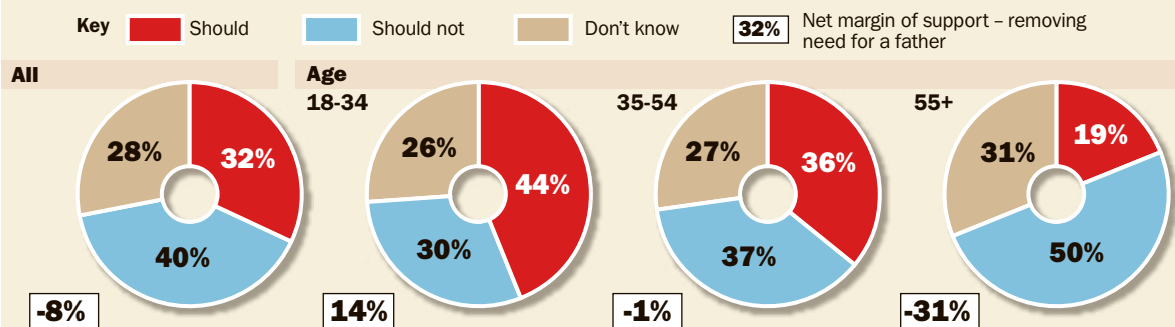

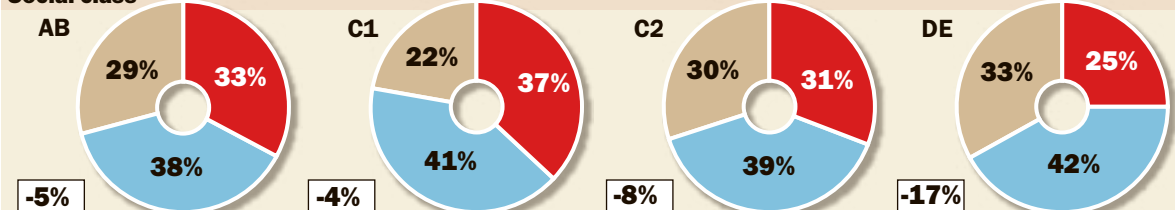
# Should IVF proceed without the 'need for a father'?

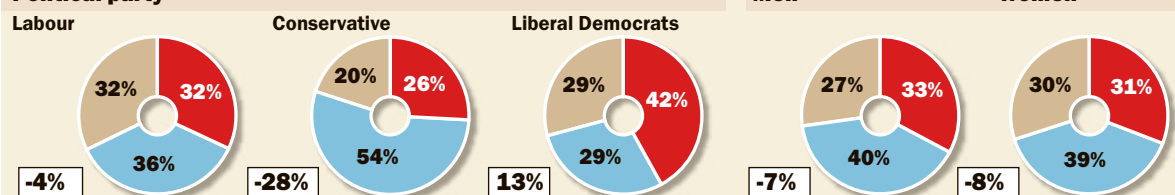
