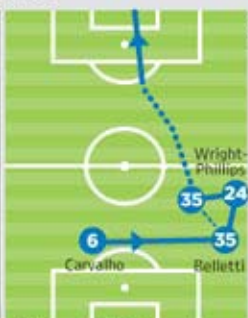


## Best goals by a distance

## Liverpool's rugby special

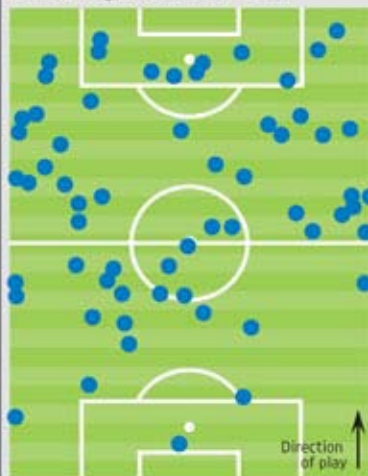

Having fielded two strikers in their first 13 games of the season in all competitions, when the Australian was absent through injury, they have deployed Cahill in the hole behind a lone centre forward in the subsequent four matches, all of which have ended in victory

## Full value

The full backs played a full part in making the Arsenal-Manchester United match exciting, regularly advancing close to the opponent's byline. Neatly, each of the four players had a big hand in creating a goal in the 2-2 draw. Bacary Sagna cut the ball back for Cesc Fàbregas to score Arsenal's first goal while Gaël Clichy's left-wing cross created the confusion during which William Gallas added their second. Wes Brown sent Cristiano Ronaldo away to cross for Gallas's own goal for United, before Patrice Evra charged down the left to tee up their second by Ronaldo
