

Show us your medals: the Olympic funding dividend

UK Sport has identified 41 prospective British medal-winners in Beijing. If 85 per cent of them deliver, it will hit its target of 35 medals and a possible eighth place in the medals table. It hopes to scoop up to a dozen golds
