Christmas? It's on the cards

Want a merry Christmas and to save the planet? Here's an easy way to make cards for friends and family using recycled paper

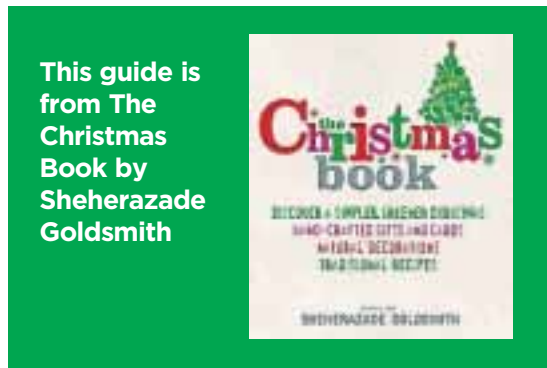
1 Draw a template of your choice on to card or paper — for example, a star or a Christmas tree — and cut it out.



2 Place the template on a piece of patterned recycled paper — try old wrapping paper, last year's Christmas cards, magazines or wallpaper. Draw around it and cut out the shape.



3 Take a piece of recycled card and fold it in half, or use a ready made, plain recycled card. Glue the shape on the front. You could make templates of smaller stars to glue around the main shape.
